#### **ISWP Background: 2015 to Date**



- Mission: Serve as a global resource for wheelchair service standards and provision through advocacy, education, standards, evidence-based practice, innovation and a platform for information exchange.
- Vision: All people who need wheeled mobility devices receive the appropriate products and services with dignity, enabling them to access education, employment and health care and to participate in their communities.
- Funding: ~\$6M USAID grant funded, housed at the University of Pittsburgh; some other grants and donations
- 5 active Working Groups and Subcommittees, 100s+ volunteers: Integration, Academic Training Partners, Educators' Package, Competency, Product Standards

#### **Sector Goal**

Develop a competent workforce of multi-sectoral wheelchair service personnel through the establishment of regional training centers that utilize existing and newly developed resources.












#### **Organizational Structure**


